1	Section-III	-	Form-01	The criteria prescribed in FORM 1 for Individual Firms as well as Consortium of Firms is either an end user or trader, use of dry bottom ash is not a common practice in Bangladesh and therefore those of us who are trading/carrying/handling dry fly ash for decades also do not trade in dry bottom fly ash because there is no use of it in this market. However, Principals based in West Bengal with whom traders/ carriers are associated and procuring Dry Fly ash for decades hold the experience of handling dry bottom ash. Therefore, the criteria should include ash handler so that local firms can associate with their foreign partners and participate as a consortium.	Applicant's may refer Sl. No 2 and Sl. No 7 of Amendment no-01 to the EOI Document.
2	Section-III	-	Form 2A, Part B	Dry Bottom Ash is meant to be used for construction and land filling purposes, but since Bangladesh is a river based country it has enormous supply of low cost sand for land filling and construction purposes. Therefore, how much Dry Bottom Ash can be a cost effective substitute for sand needs to be evaluated. Dry Bottom Ash is not used for cement manufacturing, manufacturing of ready mix concrete or Ash Bricks in Bangladesh. Thus, these options should be stroked out at the first place.	Applicant has to fill up the relevant option as indicated in the form (Section-III) for the usage of Bottom Ash.
3	Section-III	-	Form 3B	It says, Consortium partners should meet Financial criteria mentioned in Clause-4.2 in section 1 and each partner of the consortium should meet 25% of the financial criteria in Clause 4.2 Clause 4.2 of Section-I." It is not exactly clear what financial criteria should be be met to qualify as Consortium Partners and on what basis is the 25% financial criteria calculated.	Each Consortium partner shall meet atleast 25% of the average annual turnover for the offtake of bottom ash quantity as indicated in clause 4.2. Regarding the basis of 25%, Applicant to comply with the provisions of the EOI.
